TELL US ABOUT YOUR JOURNEY SO FAR.

I am currently an apprentice in tiling and slating. I spent my first six months working on site before committing to the training, which helped me understand the job properly and make sure it was the right path for me. I have now been with the company for two years and attend college in one-week block releases in London.

When I finish my apprenticeship, my goal is to progress to a lead roofer role and, in the long term, run my own roofing company.

My employer and training provider have supported me throughout by giving me proper training, guidance, and opportunities to learn from experienced tradespeople.

Aldridge & Sons Roofing Ltd is a family-run roofing company based in Surrey. The company carries out all types of roofing work, which means I get a wide range of hands-on experience across different jobs.
