Excellence in Roofing Awards winners announced

The UK roofing industry celebrated and recognised outstanding industry achievements at The National Federation of Roofing Contractors Ltd (NFRC) Annual Congress awards lunch last Friday (15 May) in Telford when some 530 celebrated all that is best in roofing.

Cheeky TV presenter, Melissa Porter, presented the International Roofing Federation competition winners. NFRC was joined by the European Liquid Waterproofing Association (ELWA) the Single Ply Roofing Association (SPRA) and for the first time the Lead Contractors Association (LCA).

The Excellence in Roofing Awards recognised and rewarded outstanding roofing projects in all the major roofing disciplines. The following winners were selected based on demonstrated quality workmanship, technical difficulties encountered, problem solving, environmental qualities and aesthetics.

Of all the Safety in Roofing Award applicants the following received the highest score in their roofing discipline: M Camilleri & Sons Roofing (South Wales) Ltd for slating and tiling; Briggs Amasco Ltd for flat roofing; and Progressive Systems Ltd for sheeting and cladding. Gold, silver and bronze awards were presented to a large number of members at the regional annual general meetings.

The competitors who took part in the World Championships for Young Roofers were also formally recognised by the industry at the lunch. In the Roof Slating and Tiling category were James Hill (Southwest Roofing Services Ltd) and Robert Creighton (Elliotts Premier Roofing Ltd), in the Waterproofing category were Terry Peck (Capital Roofing Co Ltd) and Mark McAcoy (Watershed Roofing Ltd).

Kevin Taylor, NFRC's Technical and Training Officer, was presented with the Exceptional Contribution to Training 2008 Award from ConstructionSkills.

The opportunity was also taken at the awards to present the Lead Contractors Association's Murdoch Award and Murdoch Sponsors Award for the best leadwork. The Murdoch Award was won by D Blake and Co for their project at the McManus Galleries and Museum in Dundee. The Murdoch Sponsors Award (sponsored by Associated Lead Mills) was won by Norfolk Sheet Lead for their work on Langley School in Norfolk.

Long serving NFRC Board member and Past President, Geoff Holt received the highest NFRC award, Honorary Life Membership.
